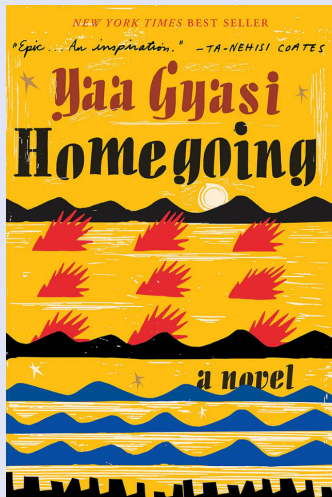


EVENING BOOK GROUP
