
## **EVENING BOOK GROUP**



## ABOUT THE BOOK

EMMA GATEWOOD TOLD HER FAMILY SHE WAS GOING ON A WALK AND LEFT HER SMALL OHIO HOMEOOWN WITH A CHANGE OF CLOTHES AND LESS THAN TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS, THE NEXT ANYBODY HEARD FROM HER, THIS GENTEEL, FARM PEARED, SIXTY-SEVEN-YEAR-OLD GREAT-GRANDMOTHER HAD WALKEE BOO MILES ALONG THE ZOSO-MILE APPALACHIAN TRAIL BY SEPTEMBER 195S, SHE STOOD ATOP MAINES MOUNT KATAHDIN, SANG "AMERICA, THE BEAUTIFUL," AND PROCLAIMED, "I SAID TILL DO IT, AND IT ED."

DRIVEN BY A PAINFUL MARRIAGE, GRANDMA GATEWOOD NOT ONLY HIKED THE TRAIL ALONE, SHE WAS THE FIRST PERSON—MAN OR WOMAN—TO WALK! IT TWICE AND THREE TIMES, AT AGE SEVENTY-ONE, SHE HIKED THE ZOOD-MILE OREGON TRAIL. GATEWOOD BECAME A HIKING CELEBRITY.
